We are back into the Fall season. Children are back at school, the leaves are starting to change, and we are ramping up for a Fun Fall season with activities and fundraisers. The Saturday Fun Club is being offered again for 6 Sessions this Fall. This is a very popular Support for many ASD children and their parents. Registration is underway so don't miss out! We will also be offering the **Family Fun Night**, open for all children in the family.

We had another successful Camp Kaleidoscope this summer – marking our 9th Year! We hosted over 334 Weekly Spots. We continue to welcome new families and support our existing families over the summer. The feedback from parents and children is very positive. We have been alternating between a west end school and east end school for a number of years. Although not ideal, this does provide a level of fairness for families who live in different parts of the city. It is a challenge to find a school that is completely central with the facilities we require for the children.

We were able to access some additional funding this past year, which will assist with our programs. We have reached out to Wayne Hussey of the Danbe Foundation to provide our Board with training on fundraising and community support. The Danbe Foundation has been supportive of Children at Risk and we welcome the additional support. We do have one of our higher profile fundraisers coming soon. It is the Celebrity Pumpkin Event, where we have pumpkins and prizes donated from across the city from our local politicians, celebrities and business owners. We will be in four malls and we plan to have some prizes to be bid in the mall with the majority in an on-line auction only. We hope this will help generate even more bids and provide better access for all participants.

We are looking for Volunteers, Prizes and Pumpkin Celebrities and Donors.

We are (still) in the process of making some administrative staffing changes. We are hoping to have this completed shortly and have a full staff compliment going into the busy October and November timeframe. Please bear with us as we make the transitions. I hope you all have a wonderful and enjoyable autumn season.

Well – we made it through the Summer and our 9th incredible year of Camp Kaleidoscope! As Many of you Year or early January. know – it was nip and tuck, coming down to the wire for I the confirmation on the Focus on Youth Funding through the Ontario Provincial Ministry of Education. GOOD news is that at the 11th Hour – the Funding was confirmed again - and Camp K was able to access our School location, scramble ahead and eventually book 334 I To Be Continued.... Weekly Camp Spots. The NOT SO GOOD news was that - due to the effort Children at Risk had to put into Lobbying the Ministry and Provincial MPP's –it left little time to Fundraise and we were unable to accept as many Campers as last year (2018-356 Weekly Camp Spots) – and increase the Cost. The numbers look small – not quite a 7% decrease – 22 Camp Spots – but if this was YOUR child who missed a Week of Camp K this Summer – we understand the significance!

So we Hope we can get our Families to unite for 2020 and help Children at Risk MAKE a concerted Effort to let not just our Local Members of Provincial Parliament know and understand the Critical Importance of this Funding – but ALL 124 MPP's in Ontario! When we reached out in the Spring – many were very receptive – and many did not know about the Focus on Youth Funding and what support it provides for both non-profit and charitable groups, but marginalized students as well...It is critically important that we keep the momentum for this Program and Funding going – in the minds and hearts of those who represent their constituents in ALL of Ontario.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE (Cont'd)

This year the Confirmation was WELL after the Budget (which was already tabled 1month later than in 2018) – leaving MANY like CAR in limbo with Questions like: Would we have Camp, Where would Camp be, What would be the Cost of Camp, What would be the Dates of Camp?

With our Fall Supports starting, Fundraisers coming up our Pumpkin Celebrity Event, Autism Brunch, Difference Makers Darts & Bowling - as well as our Fall Raffle in November – I will have to shelve this Project for a few months. With the Focus on the Federal Election – I am sure that most MPP's would not pay too much attention at this moment, as well. However have this Pinned to my Calendar to address later this

If anything - this year has shown the Power of The Lobbying, Communication and Persistence in matters that affect our Autism Community.

Ingredients:

For the muffins:

- 1 1/4 cup all purpose flour
- 1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2/3 cup white sugar
- 2 cups chopped fresh (or canned) peaches
- 1/2 cup whole milk
- 1 egg
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil

For the streusel topping:

- 1/4 cup all purpose flour
- 1/4 cup white sugar
- 1 pinch cinnamon
- 3 tablespoons cold unsalted butter

Instructions

For the muffins:

- 1. Preheat your oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit and prepare a large muffin tin with 8 muffin cups.
- 2. Add the flour, baking powder, salt and sugar to a large bowl and whisk together to combine.
- 3. Add the peaches, reserving about 3/4 cup for topping the muffins, and stir to coat.
- 4. Add the milk, egg and oil and stir together with a rubber spatula just until the flour disappears.
- 5. Portion the batter out into the muffin cups evenly (about 3/4 full).

For the topping:

- 1. Combine the flour, sugar and cinnamon in a small bowl and stir.
- 2. Add the cold butter in chunks and break it up with your fingers in the flour mixture until it resembles coarse crumbs.
- 3. Top the muffins with the remaining chunks of peaches and a spoonful of the streusel topping.
- 4. Bake at 350 degrees Fahrenheit for about 20 minutes until golden brown and a toothpick inserted into one of the muffins comes out clean.

Store in an airtight container for up to 3 days.

Ingredients:

- 3 or 4 ripe bananas, smashed
- 1/3 cup melted butter
- 1 cup sugar (or can use ¾ if you prefer)
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 teaspoon Vanilla
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- Pinch of salt
- 1 ½ cups of all purpose flour (or 1 cup all purpose, ½ cup whole wheat)

Method:

No need for a mixer for this recipe. Preheat the oven to 350 degree F (175 C). With a mixing spoon, mix butter 1st Fun Club date of October 5, 2019. into the mashed bananas in a large bowl. Since November 2012 - Children at Risk has been offering Saturday Fun Club Activity/Respite Sessions on Saturdays. We are opening up Registration for Fun Club to all families. If your child has attended Camp Kaleidoscope in 2019, an intake will not be necessary. However, if your child is new to Children at Risk and/or attended Camp in 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 or 2018 - we would require an intake.

Utilizing management and counsellors from Children At Risk's Camp Kaleidoscope, we used many of the activities that proved so successful at Camp. Each Fun Club session runs for 5 hours, 10 AM to 3 PM, for children and youth aged 4 to 18+ years of age. SFC will not be exactly like summer camp, but with adequate and qualified support staff, your child/youth will have five hours of fun and creativity with peers. Organized activities will include but not limited to: Mad Science, Crafts, Computer Games, Gym Circuits, can turn Saturdays into the best day of the week! As at Camp, as well, activities will align with ability - allowing older participants to influence the content to have the best experience.





Camp Kalzidoscopz

Despite 2019 being our 9th Camp Kaleidoscope, every year is unique. The swap in locations between East and West end Ottawa brings both benefits and challenges; changes in the number of groups operating and Group Leaders and the mix of both returning and new counsellors bring a different energy and along with the Campers that make up the groups there can be a different dynamic almost weekly as Campers attend different weeks for their summer camp experience.

In addition, each year there seems to be a change in the age

range ratio of the Campers. 2017 saw a greater increase attendance of and our youngest age range where as in 2019 there was a greater increase in older Campers attending for the first time in addition to our regular attendees being older. This has a direct correlation on the activities organized and outings which are most appropriate – and then you add in the weather that can derail all your plans!



Yet again Camp Kaleidoscope 2019 delivered on its three mandates:

1. Provide a safe, inclusive and fun filled active experience for Campers of all ages and functionality. Daily schedules were orientated around the energy levels, interests and abilities of the Campers whether verbal or non-verbal and making adjustments and accommodations so that every Camper could participate and be successful. 334 Camp slots were provided to 121 campers, 90 of which were returning having attended previous years.

CAMP K 2019 (Cont'd)

- 2. Provide respite to families where parents could continue working, make plans or spend dedicated time with their other children safe in the knowledge that they wouldn't be called to pick up their child on the spectrum for autism related issues. 115 Families with 6 sets of siblings took advantage of attending for one to five weeks with a number of families requesting additional weeks.
 - education Autism and awareness comprehensive training at both March Break Camp and Camp Kaleidoscope combined with the natural environment training at both camps and Saturday Fun Club sessions is educating young people on autism and effective ways of preventing and dealing with behaviours that are often associated with ASD Clubbers/Campers. We are educating these young people to be more open minded as to how funny, talented and capable our youth on the autism spectrum can be. The hope is that they will take this knowledge into their neighbourhoods, schools, and future careers and educate others. In our Camp crew feedback form many indicated that the experience of working at Camp K had not only improved their work ethic but had influenced their future career choices, the realization of what they were or were not capable of, how important it was to be reliable and turn up on time and work all day in a job that was more physically and mentally demanding than

they had expected and how much more tired they were than after a school day but all said they had a great summer and valued the experience. We had 71 Camp crew attending Camp Kaleidoscope for their first year and doubled we the number of male 2018 crew over numbers.

It is heartbreaking to have your child treated so shabbily, to be excluded from an "inclusive" camp for doing nothing more than not immediately understanding the social rules. amazing people at Camp Kaleidoscope lessen our isolation, make us feel like we have a place to turn and a welcoming community where we belong. Camp Kaleidoscope allows me to keep my job, and at the same time allows my child to smile, be himself, and spend part of his summer with his peers. I could not be more grateful for the dedication and hard work of the women who make this camp possible, the attention to detail and the kindness that they show even when overworked and probably under-appreciated. The people running the camp do an excellent job of hiring and training young people who behave in generous and responsible ways, doing their best to offer all the campers fun and companionship. Research shows that mothers of severely affected children like my son have similar physiological stress profiles as combat soldiers. Part of the reason for this is the lack of actual support that exactly the kind of support that parents like me need. They create happy, safe and life-improving experiences for my child. They do everything they can to make it more likely I can afford to pay his camp fees—and they do so with no help from any level of government. My gratitude to the people who run Children at Risk and
