#### **AVIVA COMMUNITY FUND**

After much deliberation, consideration and, most of all, calculation – Children at Risk decided to pull out of the Aviva Community Fund Contest ... Children at Risk was more than excited when the AVIVA Community Fund was suggested as a potential fundraiser for Camp Kaleidoscope! We felt we had a great idea that served the ASD community of Ottawa in a unique way and one that was in demand from parents – keeping with our mandate to "fill in the gaps" in services! It took 4 years to secure the funding for 2011 and with funding for 2012 currently out of reach, having one concentrated effort secure potentially \$50K to \$100K was a great opportunity.

Unfortunately reality was against us.

- 1. We have a limited membership being an Ottawa only based small charity through 2 Rounds of Voting we were unable to gain any ground keeping in mind that only the Top 30 in each category (10 in each of 3 rounds) get into the semi-finals AND THEN THE TOP 10 FOR THE FINALS.
- 2. There were many ideas submitted for the Ottawa area and many directly supporting the ASD community, which further reduced the number of votes that we could solicit.
- 3. Despite our efforts to gain new votes, we were still only at 28 of 30 in our category! All this would mean is asking our Supporters to go through 3 rounds of voting and if we made it to the semi-finals, another 4<sup>th</sup> round of voting WITHOUT MAKING IT INTO THE TOP 10 CHOSEN FOR THE FINAL ROUND OF JUDGING.

It is with this in mind that we made a decision to withdraw Camp Kaleidoscope from the AVIVA Community Fund competition. We felt, in all good conscience, that we could not ask our supporters to vote through two more rounds of effort with no potential of a favourable outcome. We are very grateful to the 627 supporters that we had voting for Camp Kaleidoscope and we hope that you will agree with our assessment of the situation. We know that many of you voted willingly, happily and daily for our cause! 
