Children at Risk is growing up — we are a hard-working, respectable 35 year-old — with a responsible attitude to helping Families raising a child(ren) diagnosed within the Autism Spectrum Disorders to the best of our abilities! 

Thanks to funding from The City of Ottawa **Community Projects** & The Community Foundation of Ottawa, our pilot Saturday Fun Club became a fully fledged Children At Risk program for both activities for ASD children, as well as respite for families needing a few hours during the school year! Timely funding from the Unity for Autism Foundation allowed Fun Club to continue in January 2014 – as well as the offering of March Break Camp, too!



Seven sessions operated between September to December 2013 with 18 to 27 Clubbers attending each session and nine sessions ran from January to June 2014 with 25 to 35 Clubbers per session. The increase in the number of clubbers able to attend was partly due to many more Counsellors joining the team having come on board for March Break Camp, interviewing for Camp Kaleidoscope or having heard about the program through relevant Algonquin College or University programs. All Counsellors proudly wear their dedicated Fun Club T shirts with plenty of paint and glue stains as evidence of successful fun sessions!

The Clubbers are divided into three age ranges each Saturday Fun Club offers a Fun environment to with their own dedicated rooms and Group Leaders. A youth with autism aged 4 to 18 years of age. No one was ever hungry the Saturdays that Saturday Fun Club ran. Cooking and baking was definitely a preferred activity by clubbers and staff alike. Seasonal influences meant candy apples and rice crispy nests with chocolate eggs, Halloween called for spiders and ghost cookies and December sessions had eggnog influenced fare such as Eggnog pretzel fudge. The youth groups' Chicken pot pie and Red Pepper Humus were trumped

by the teens group serving up fried eggs with turkey bacon and pancakes.





- 1.5 cups blanched almond flour
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon vanilla
- 3 tablespoons cold butter or coconut oil
- 2 tablespoons honey
- 1 egg

### Custard

- ½ tablespoon unflavored gelatin
- 1 tablespoon water
- 1 cup almond milk (or any other non-dairy milk)
- ½ cup honey
- 1 vanilla bean, seeds scraped and bean reserved
- 3 egg yolks
- 1 cup coconut cream (cream that has risen to the top from a cold can of coconut milk)
- 3 cups mixed berries (I used strawberries, blackberries, blueberries, and raspberries)

### **Instructions:**

- 1. Soften the gelatin by placing it in a bowl with the 1 tablespoon of water.
- 2. Heat the almond milk, seeds from the vanilla bean, and the bean shell over medium-high heat for 2-3 minutes.
- 3. Whisk the egg yolks and honey in a separate bowl, then slowly pour the heated milk mixture into the bowl while whisking constantly.
- 4. Return the mixture to the pan and heat for 2-3 minutes while whisking the entire time. Pour in the softened gelatin, and whisk until it is dissolved. Continue heating for another 5 minutes until the custard has thickened and will coat the back of a spoon.
- 5. Pour the custard into a bowl and press a piece of plastic wrap directly on top to avoid a skin from forming. Place in the refrigerator and chill for about 5 hours or overnight.
- 6. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

### **RECIPE CORNER (Cont'd)**

- 7. Place the pecans in a food processor and process until you have a coarse flour. Add the almond flour, salt, baking soda, cinnamon, nutmeg, butter/coconut oil, honey, egg, and vanilla and pulse until a ball of dough forms.
- 8. Using the palms of your hands, press the dough into the bottom and up the sides of a tart pan with a removable base. Cut a circle of parchment paper and lightly press it onto the bottom of the crust. Fill the bottom with pie weights or a cup of beans, then bake for 10 minutes. Remove the beans and parchment, then bake for another 5 minutes. Cool the crust while you make the custard.
- 9. Remove the custard from the fridge and pour in the cup of thick coconut cream from the top of 1 can of coconut milk. Using an electric hand mixer or stand mixer, whip the custard until thick and creamy. If your coconut cream is super thick (this will depend on which brand you use), you can add in a tablespoon of the coconut water to help thin it out a bit.
- 10. Spread the custard into the cooled pie crust then chill the tart for an hour to let the custard set up.
- 11. Arrange your berries in a circular pattern then serve immediately, or keep in the fridge until you are ready to serve.

My name is Cathy Paquette, author of "The Treasures of Special Needs Parenting: Tips and Strategy Gems". I am a mother of three wonderful and challenging children. Two have ADD and were tested as gifted. This presented an unusual situation for the schools who were prepared with gifted programs or to challenge them but did not have the training or resources within those programs to deal with the obstacles that stood in the way of that child being able to tap those gifts. For that they needed to attend Special Needs programs which did not address their gifted needs.

My third and most challenging child has Attention Deficit Disorder with Hyperactivity (ADHD) combined with Conduct Disorder, Oppositional Defiance Disorder and Depression. I believe that, if he were to be retested today, he would be placed somewhere at the top of the spectrum. He provided the extreme sport in the family....Extreme stress...extreme frustration...extreme joy...extreme love...extreme exhaustion...extreme fear for his future....

I also grew up as a child with the same difficulties. Unfortunately the level of understanding and resources were not as advanced, yet some of the skills that they used are still practiced today. While these special needs can create obstacles parenting these special children, I believe that they gave me a unique insight into their behaviours and contributed to our success.

### Why I created the book?

While these special needs can create parenting challenges, I whole heartily believe that there are ways to manage and successfully overcome these challenges faced by special needs families that celebrate their uniqueness without highlighting the social stigma associated with special needs.

In response to other special needs parents' demands, I wrote an book entitled, "The Treasures of Special Needs Parenting – Tips and Strategy Gems" that shows parents how to efficiently and successfully navigate the complexity of parenting special needs children while focusing on each special child's "treasure", or uniquely endearing qualities.

This workbook is filled with tips and strategies to help parents to review their own situation, and create a plan of action that will bring them a sense of hope. From my research I have found that my book, from its perspective, is unique. It is an easy read, with no repetition. So parents who are already on the run and exhausted can throw it in their bag and read it in between activities and appointments, and easily pull the information from it that they need. My publisher, Raymond Coderre (Baico Publishing) noted that it read like talking to his aunt (e.g. comforting and easy).


